# MAY IS ELECTRICAL SAFETY MONTH Here are a few tips to help keep you safe all year long...

- Never use a product with a damaged electrical cord.
- Never use extension cords on a permanent basis.
- Install ground fault circuit interrupters in areas that may be wet or damp.
- Install tamper-resistant outlets or protective coverings.
- If an appliance repeatedly blows a fuse, trips a circuit breaker, or has given you an electric shock, immediately unplug it and have it repaired or replaced.

## Energy Efficiency Tip of the Month

Even in summer months, adding insulation to your attic can keep your home more comfortable and save energy used by your cooling system. If your attic insulation is level with or below your floor joists (meaning you can easily see your joists), you should add more. If you can't see any of the floor joist because the insulation is well above them, you likely have enough insulation. Attic insulation should be evenly distributed with no low spots. Make sure the areas along the eaves are adequately covered.
